High Bag Use This Summer

Maybe dry weather has brought more people and dogs out to River Park this summer but regular park users are certainly noticing more volume and less parking spaces.

I notice the increase in a different way — through the poop bag use. It's really evident to me because I fill the dispensers. One morning in August, I filled each of the three bag dispensers with 300 bags. By early the next night, they were all empty! Really? Does that mean 900 people forgot to bring a bag over a period of 36 hours? Wow... This is so disappointing!

Just a reminder that the poop bags provided at River Park is a back-up system; it's not a free supply for people with dogs to take advantage of at will.

This kind of high use is unsustainable. When we first got the bag dispenser in December 2008, The City of Calgary supplied bags. After 16 months they stopped supplying bags in April 2010 because we went through more than their budget allowed. Yes, the bottom line is a clean park, but we have to remember, bags are NOT free.

I worry about fundraising again. The first time was easy; the second time, not so much. And by the way, only a small percent of the park users donate. Our group will have to fundraise for approximately \$6000 early in 2016.

For now, please support us and the park by spreading the word about reducing use.







New Additions at River Park

Next time you walk at River Park, spend an extra few moments to stop and take notice...The City of Calgary has added lots of new trees this summer!

All of the new additions are marked with a small piece of neon plastic tape. Please don't remove them! These markers help the contracted landscaping companies to easily identify and spot the trees at a distance so they ensure to water the right ones.
