River Park Construction Update

Still avoiding River Park because of construction? We notice numbers continue to be lower but if you haven't been walking the park, here's a small summary of the changes we noticed in September:

- Most of the blue temporary fencing has been removed at the south end
- · Black frost fencing remains around new plants
- Preparations have begun to pour the cement pad for the middle dumpster
- Blue temporary fencing was extended on both sides of the trail in the north end of the park
- Many of the poles have been replaced
- Seating around the newly moved Eric Harvie rock
- Unknown work at the south end in the staging area (looks like removal of big rocks)

We have not received any information so we can only provide a progress report based on our observations.

Onleash Only at River Park

There's been a LOT of talk about the off-leash part of River Park becoming on-leash when work is completed or beginning sometime in 2017. We started hearing this in July but we were really inundated with comments and questions during our September event at River Park.

On September 27, Councillor Brian Pincott addressed this concern on Twitter: "Nope. No truth to that at all."

The development plans for River Park on The City of Calgary website continue to show off-leash access on both sides of the spine trail from the parking lot to the fence by the dumpster at the north end (approximately 40 Ave).

Let's hope this is true and that plans will not change in the future.

Shed Some Light On It

If you walk your dog in River Park around 8pm, you'll notice it's dark out there! Less light means it's harder to see your dog and most definitely harder to find their poop. We're so fortunate to have lights along the trail in River Park. Problem is our dogs often head away from the trail to do their business and there are plenty of areas the light does not reach.

The solution is easy. We just have to be more diligent about keeping the dog within sight. Besides using a flashlight, we can also dress up the dog with an illuminated collar or light-up bobble. Bike lights are also an inexpensive option. It's somewhat festive dressing up the dog! If you're not on board already, please consider one of these options for the dogs' safety and to help keep the park clean.

Does Halloween cause stress and anxiety for your pet? Help them have the best experience possible. Here are some tips to give your furry family member a paw up during the event.

Decorations

- · Pet-proof indoor and outdoor items
- · Jack o' lanterns or candles and tails don't mix well

Costume Tips

- · Make sure costumes are comfy and unrestrictive
- · Don't limit their movement or senses
- · Watch for choking hazards
- Choose a bright color and make sure ID tags are worn if they're outside

Mental and Physical Health

- Watch for any signs of stress or anxiety when trying to dress your pet in costume
- · Ensure your pet doesn't bolt out the door
- · Have a quiet spot for them to hang out
- Avoid a bite incident ensure your pet doesn't get spooked by people in costumes

Treats

- · Keep people treats in a secure location
- Chocolate and candies or gum (containing xylitol) are extremely toxic for dogs
- Candy wrappers are a choking hazard and can cause a painful and/or costly obstruction
