Easter Egg Hunt for Dogs

Annually, thousands of plastic eggs filled with dog treats are hidden over a defined area of a local park. Each egg contains a dog treat and a sticker, representing a chance to win one of hundreds of great prizes.

Registrants receive two egg cartons, giving them the opportunity to collect up to 24 eggs. Participants who collect donations on NSD's behalf are eligible to collect more eggs based on the dollar value of the donations they received:

Please make sure your dog is under control. According to Animal and Bylaw Services, dogs are supposed to be on-leash in parking lots and the street. Off-leash access only applies to designated areas with a sign stating so. Avoid a costly ticket, but most importantly, please keep your dog safe!
