Chicken Dog Bickies



Spoil your pooch during the holiday season. If you like to bake, here's the perfect opportunity to try out a new recipe for dog treats.

Ingredients

2 cups cooked chicken (finely chopped)
2 cups whole wheat flour or white flour
1 container (5.3-ounce) non-fat plain yogurt
3/4 cup water

1 egg, lightly beaten

Mix ingredients in a medium bowl. Place/flatten onto baking sheets (little spread occurs). Bake 12-14 minutes at 350 degrees. Refrigerate or freeze.

Keeping Our Pets Safe During the Holiday Season

Our pets are very important family members and many of us feel strongly about including them in all aspects of the holidays.

While many homes transform during the holiday season, we sometimes inadvertently create a few hazards for our pets. Here are some tips to make sure festivities are incident-free for the furry ones! May every dog enjoy a fun and safe holiday season.

Toxic Plants

Steer clear of seasonal plants such as holly, mistletoe, poinsettias and lilies. Keep in mind, pine needles can result in stomach upset or puncture if ingested. Check out this alphabetical list of toxic plants for dogs from the UK Kennel Club.

Decorations and Packages

Avoid an intestinal blockage or accidental poisoning. Tinsel, string, ribbon, cloth and various package adornments may be irresistable for pets. Ensure reservoir water for live trees is inaccessible as sap from the tree can be toxic. Use safe, unbreakable items to decorate and store gifts out of sight until the big day.

Electrical Cords

Secure cords to baseboards as they're tripping, tangling and electrocution hazards.

Pet Gifts

Buy non-toxic toys from a reputable supplier. Watch for items with bits and parts that can be easily chewed off and ingested.

Food

Watch the amount of treats they consume. Just like us, overindulging can cause tummy upset.

Be careful that your furry family members don't sample or devour any chocolate, gum or candies with Xylitol (sweetner) or rich and fatty human foods. And please note Xylitol is extremely toxic to dogs as even small amounts of it can cause hypoglycemia (low blood sugar), seizures, liver failure or even death.

Entertaining / Activity / Noise

To reduce stress, make sure they have a quiet place to hang out. Inform well-meaning children and guests that pets need respect and space too.
