Wanted: Feedback

In case you missed signs in the area, The City of Calgary announced another Sandy Beach project that includes the upgrading of park and recreation infrastructure to improve conditions for people who use the area in various ways.

City Council recently approved \$30M for this new project stating they are responding to "increased pedestrian and vehicular traffic, increases in population and the diversity of users, the needs change and we need to respond to these needs. The proposed project will provide the neighbourhood, local businesses, and visitors with an improved public realm for safe, easy, and accessible travel".

City Council encourages engagement and feedback options:

- 1. Attend a virtual info session on Dec 8 from 6 to 7:15pm
- 2. Provide online feedback from Nov 27 to Dec 15

Offer your opinion on three topics:

- · design of the entry area
- · programming and recreational amenities
- · sidewalk/pathway improvements

Many of us may remember a similar effort when the area received extensive upgrades through a \$14M development plan done in 2011.
